

DID YOU KNOW?

- The oceans make up 99 percent of the living space on the planet.
- The majority of life on earth is aquatic.
- In the ocean you will find the world's longest mountain chain.
- There are more historic artifacts under the sea than in all the world's museums.
- Our ocean, the Pacific Ocean, is the largest ocean on Earth.

THE PACIFIC OCEAN...

- is the largest and the deepest ocean on Earth.
- covers 30% of the Earth. It covers more area than all the world's continents combined.
- contains the Mariana Trench the deepest known trench at 35,760 feet (6.77 miles) deep.
- was discovered by Spanish explorere, Vasco Nunez de Balboa (Balboa Park is named after him.)
- is not as salty as the Atlantic Ocean.
- is the most polluted ocean on Earth.
- is the "spacecraft cemetery." Many spacecraft and satellites end up in the Pacific Ocean when they fall to Earth.
