WHAT HAPPENS TO PLASTIC PACKAGING?

32% of plastic packaging ends up as litter in the environment.

40% is in a landfill somewhere

14% is incinerated

14% is recycled but only 2% is effectively recycled.



8 million metric tons — Amount of plastic that enters the ocean every year. That's one city garbage truck full of plastic being dumped into the ocean every minute of every day.

1,200 — Number of species endangered by plastic ingestion or entanglement

2100 — Year when all World Heritage coral reefs could be destroyed due to pollution and warming waters according to UNESCO



15 minutes — Average time a single-use plastic bag is used

110,000 microplastic particles — The amount of plastics the average American adult ingests every year

6 million plastic fibers released during an average laundry load of synthetic fabric

National Wildlife Federation

- » By 2050 there will be more plastic by weight in the ocean than fish.
- » Half of all plastic on the planet was produced in the last 15 years.
- » Fifteen years ago, more products were sold in glass and aluminum containers – both are easily recycled.
- » \$1.5 billion is being invested into cleaning up plastic pollution by the petrochemical industry, while \$204 billion is being invested into 334 new petrochemical facilities. What is being invested in clean-up is less than 1% of what is being spent to expand the petrochemical industry.
- » Human population has doubled since the first Earth Day in 1970.
