## REDUCING RUNGHH

urricane Hilary brought
unexpected summer rain to our
region. The National Weather
Service reported that the two-day
total from the remnants of the hurricane
amounted to 1.82 inches at the San
Diego Airport, which is about 20% of our
average annual precipitation.

Unfortunately, most of the rainwater flows straight into the bay and ocean. This runoff picks up contaminants such as soil, fertilizers, pesticides, oil, trash, and animal waste that pollute local waterways.

The San Diego County Department of Environmental Health has a general advisory cautioning people to stay out of coastal waters for 72 hours after 0.2 inches of rain or more due to contamination from urban runoff.

Excessive runoff also contributes to flooding and erosion, destroying property and beaches.

## ELEMENTS THAT REDUCE HARMFUL

- **Landscaping**. Ensure your yard includes permeable surfaces (decomposed granite, woodchips, rocks, etc.) that facilitate water absorption.
- Redirecting gutters. Direct downspouts



to permeable landscapes instead of streets and storm drains.

• Rain catchment systems. Install a rain barrel to capture up to 55 gallons of water from gutters or spouts that can be used for gardening. One inch of

rain falling on a 1,000-square-foot roof can provide 600 gallons of rainwater. Rain barrels are available at home improvement stores starting around \$100.

If you can use a lot of water for you yard, consider a cistern, which can store up to 20,000 gallons of rainwater. Cisterns are often placed underground and require professional installation.

This year's El Niño weather pattern is expected to bring more heavy rain to Coronado. Now is the time to plan for rain capture.
