If placed in recycling, they can tangle and clog the recycling machines.

In place of single-use wrapping paper, use other earth-friendly materials to wrap gifts:

• Fabric, dish towels, bandanas, or scarves can

be folded and tied as secure wrapping. Many online videos teach furoshiki which is a Japanese style of artfully wrapping with cloth.

- Reuse brown paper bags that can be decorated for gifts and then recycled.
- Gift bags can be reused year after year.
- Old maps and

newspapers can also be festive. Pages of old Eagle & Journals are an excellent and informative wrapping option!

Ribbons and bows can be saved and reused for many years. Encourage loved ones to unwrap carefully so paper can be saved for future years.
